RE: Need to act to prevent Medicare payment cuts and maintain access to specialty care

Dear Leader McConnell, Speaker Pelosi, Leader Schumer, Leader Hoyer, and Leader McCarthy:

Thank you for your leadership and your tireless efforts during the public health emergency. The Alliance of Specialty Medicine (the “Alliance”) represents more than 100,000 specialty physicians and is dedicated to the development of sound federal health care policy that fosters patient access to the highest quality specialty care. As patient and physician advocates, **we are urging you to act before the end of the year to prevent significant Medicare pay cuts**, which will impact many physician specialties effective January 1, 2021.

Based on changes to the codes for office and outpatient evaluation and management (E/M) services that the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) will implement next year, some specialties in the Alliance face cuts as high as 7% due to a statutory budget neutrality rule that requires any increases in Medicare payments to be offset by corresponding decreases. participated in the process and support the improved values for these services, we are deeply concerned that these steep cuts could have serious financial consequences for physicians who are already under financial distress due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Again, given that these payment reductions will go into effect on January 1, 2021, we urge Congress to act soon to prevent these cuts and preserve Medicare beneficiaries' timely access to specialty care.
